Let's look to the scriptures.

Genesis 1:26 Genesis 1:31

Question 1: That's Turtle-y True

Humans are the last piece of the creation puzzle and the pinnacle of God's creation process. And it is pretty obvious God continues to care and nourish His creation, both fauna and flora. But what is Man's role in all this? What does 'dominion over all living creatures" (Gen 1:26) really mean?



Question 2: Ninja Turtles To The Rescue

Adam was tasked to work ('abad') and keep ('shamar') the garden Eden. Similarly, we are entrusted to work and keep the earth, to take care of the place where God has planted us, to serve him in our rule over creation as priests in his temple.

What are ways the church and / or the CG can do this?

Question 3: Wait, how DO you make Gwailinggou?!

Read Colossians 1: 15-21. All things here refers to the entire creation. We are called to fulfill our roles as Stewards and redeem the fallen Creation. But most people understand that Gospel is primarily about the salvation of Man. How do the gospels link to creation care?

The gospel is essentially the revelation of God's righteousness through faith. In the synoptic gospels, when Jesus says he has come to "proclaim good news to the poor", the good news is more than the invitation to have one's sin forgiven. The good news is focused on the kingdom that is inaugurated in the first coming of Jesus. And of course the kingdom Jesus proclaims includes all that God is doing to bring all of his creation under his benevolent reign.






As we approach the conclusion of DMM 2022, do share with the group what are the challenges that you have undertaken and how it has impacted you.
